Event: Celebration of International Women's Day 2021

Date: 8th March, 2021.

This was followed by a recitation of a self-written poem by Apsara Dasgupta, exstudent, English Honours. The poem questioned the stereotypes that are referred to as 'femininity'.

Professors, students, ex-students all actively and eagerly participated by sending in their

pictures with the pose of International Women's Day, 2021. The theme of International Women's Day, 2021, was #Choosetochallenge.

The event celebrated women, their role and human identity, spread awareness about gender equality and many such issues, and brought together a beautiful combination of enjoyment as well as insight.
